2: pharmacy medicines	If supplied in a container with a nominal capacity of 2L or less, the container must comply with the Australian Standard (AS 2216-1997, <i>Packaging for poisonous substances</i>)	general storage requirements	May be supplied by a medical practitioner or another person who is licensed or otherwise authorised.
3: pharmacist only medicines	If supplied in a container with a nominal capacity of 2L or less, the container must comply with the Australian Standard (AS 2216-1997, <i>Packaging for poisonous substances</i>)	general storage requirements must be stored in a part of the premises to which the public does not have access	Must not be supplied by a person other than a pharmacist, medical practitioner, dental practitioner, or veterinarian, and must be acting in the lawful practice of their profession.
4: prescription only medicines	If supplied in a container with a nominal capacity of 2L or less, the container must comply with the Australian Standard (AS 2216-1997, <i>Packaging for poisonous substances</i>)	All Schedule 4 poisons must be stored in a lockable storage facility, that must remain locked except when the medical practitioner is present, unless the Schedule 4 poisons are: a) in the medical practitioner's possession; and b) the treatment room of the premises. must be stored in a part of the premises to which the public does not have access	Must not be supplied by a person other than: a person who is a medical practitioner, dental practitioner, or veterinarian and is acting in the lawful practice of their profession.
